A Reading of Tom Klingenstein's New Play *The American Queen*

In 1862, in the middle of Lincoln's first term, the civil war was going badly for the North. Without a few significant victories it was unlikely that Lincoln would win the Republican nomination in 1864. Lurking in the shadows was Lincoln's very ambitious Secretary of the Treasury, Salmon Chase who was himself angling for the nomination. Chase, a three-time widower, had a secret weapon: his beautiful and politically astute daughter, Kate Chase who was then at the center of political and social life in Washington, much to the dismay of Marry Todd Lincoln. Kate, in early 20's, was falling in love with one of Lincoln's secretaries, John Hay. But Hay was poor and Kate needed someone with money who could help finance her father's bid for the Presidency. At the same time that Kate was falling for Hay, she was being pursued by one of the richest men in America, the Governor of Rhode Island, William Sprague. So Kate had a choice: to marry for love or for money. Her father had a similar choice: to encourage Kate to marry Sprague or remain neutral.

This is the subject of new play *The American Queen*, written by Tom Klingenstein. Although the play takes some liberties with the truth, as all drama must, in broad brush strokes it is based on the historical record.

There will be a reading of the play at the 7 Lakes Alliance/Maine Lakes Resource Center, 137 Main Street, Belgrade Lakes at 4:00 o'clock on August 20.

See You Next Year

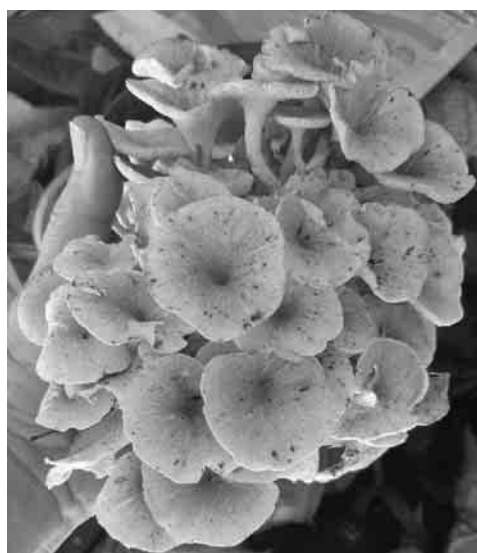

Suddenly the days are getting a little shorter and I am noticing more swamp red maples beginning to turn red in the wetlands and birches turn yellow high on the hillsides. It is still quite warm during the day, but the nights are growing cooler. Like the birds and squirrels, I am double checking my summer "to do" list and trying to make sure everything gets done. I am amazed at how many things are still on the list. In addition to looking for mushrooms and elderberries when I hike, I find myself keeping my eyes peeled for grouse, deer, and turkey signs. Those seasons are rapidly approaching, and last year's venison supply is running low in the freezer. Both the loons and the bass and pike in the lakes are chasing large schools of baitfish (mostly landlocked alewives) and trying to build up fat reserves to get through the winter. Check out the screen shot from my fish finder below. The warm surface layer has plenty of oxygen to support the large bass but the deeper water is depleted of oxygen but has enough to support the large schools of small baitfish. You can watch the larger fish dive down to grab some lunch and then return to surface layer to digest their meal. Fishing at the base of the layer, around 20 ft, with anything that looks like a minnow, will yield results.

Additionally, the loons with chicks (three currently on Long Pond) are teaching their offspring how to catch their own food. When the chicks are first born, the parents chew up fish and crayfish and basically regurgitate food morsels into their chicks' eager open mouths. The chicks grow rapidly, and the parents soon simply bring the chicks, still wriggling morsels, which the chicks grab hungrily. After a week or so of this routine, the parents simply drop the food in the water near the chicks and the chicks need to catch their food before it escapes. At the same time, the chicks are learning to dive underwater, which is a major step in evading

airborne predators such as eagles. Soon the chicks are foraging for their own food alongside the parents. Over the next two months or so, the loons will molt, replacing their insulating down with feathers, and begin to learn to fly. Those chicks that learn to fly before the lake freezes over will head to the ocean for the winter and eventually return. *Continued on page 11...*

Gaslight Theater Presents Whales of August

After a successful outdoor run of *I Hate Shakespeare* in July, Gaslight is pleased to present its first indoor production since its COVID-shortened run of John Cariani's *Last Gas* in March 2020. On Friday, August 26, *Whales of August* will open in Hallowell City Hall Auditorium, Gaslight's traditional venue. Until the pandemic intervened, Gaslight, which bills itself as Maine's "oldest continuously operating community theater," had planned to present *Whales of August* two summers ago as part of its celebration of Maine's bicentennial.

The story is set in August 1954 in a seaside cottage on a coastal Maine island. Octogenarian Libby has become blind, irritable, and socially withdrawn. She is in the November of her life, waiting to join her late husband in the hereafter. But for Libby's caregiver, her younger and also widowed sister Sarah, it is still late summer, both in Sarah's mind and on the calendar. Eternally optimistic and romantic, Sarah believes that there are still good days to come and adventures to be had.

The play is essentially one long conversation between the two sisters on the minutiae of their lives — a conversation that is often interrupted by visits from their slightly ditsy but caring neighbor Tisha Doughty, from the island's cantankerous, cussing, door-slamming handyman Joshua Brackett, and from suave Russian expatriate Nicholas Maranov, who purports to be a dispossessed nobleman.

Written by David Barry, *Whales of August* debuted in its present form in New York City in 1982. The playwright subsequently adapted his script for the screen. Filmed on Cliff Island in Casco Bay and released in 1987, the movie starred Hollywood legends Bette Davis, Lillian Gish, Vincent Price, and Ann Sothern and garnered Sothern an Academy Award nomination for best supporting actress.

In Gaslight's staging of the play, Margaret Matheson stars as Sarah, Linda Duarte as Libby, Lisa Copenhaver as Tisha, Gregor Smith as Joshua, and William Haley as Maranov. Rebecca Singer and Joseph Maranda direct.

Performances will be held August 26 – 28 and September 2 – 4. The Friday and Saturday performances will start at 7:30; the Sunday shows will be at 2:00. Tickets will cost \$15 for adults and \$13 seniors and students. Although free of sex and violence, the play contains a little profanity, and thus is not suitable for young children (who probably wouldn't be interested in the play anyway).

All performances will take place in Hallowell City Hall at 1 Winthrop Street. To reserve tickets or get additional information, visit www.gaslighttheater.org or call 626-3698.

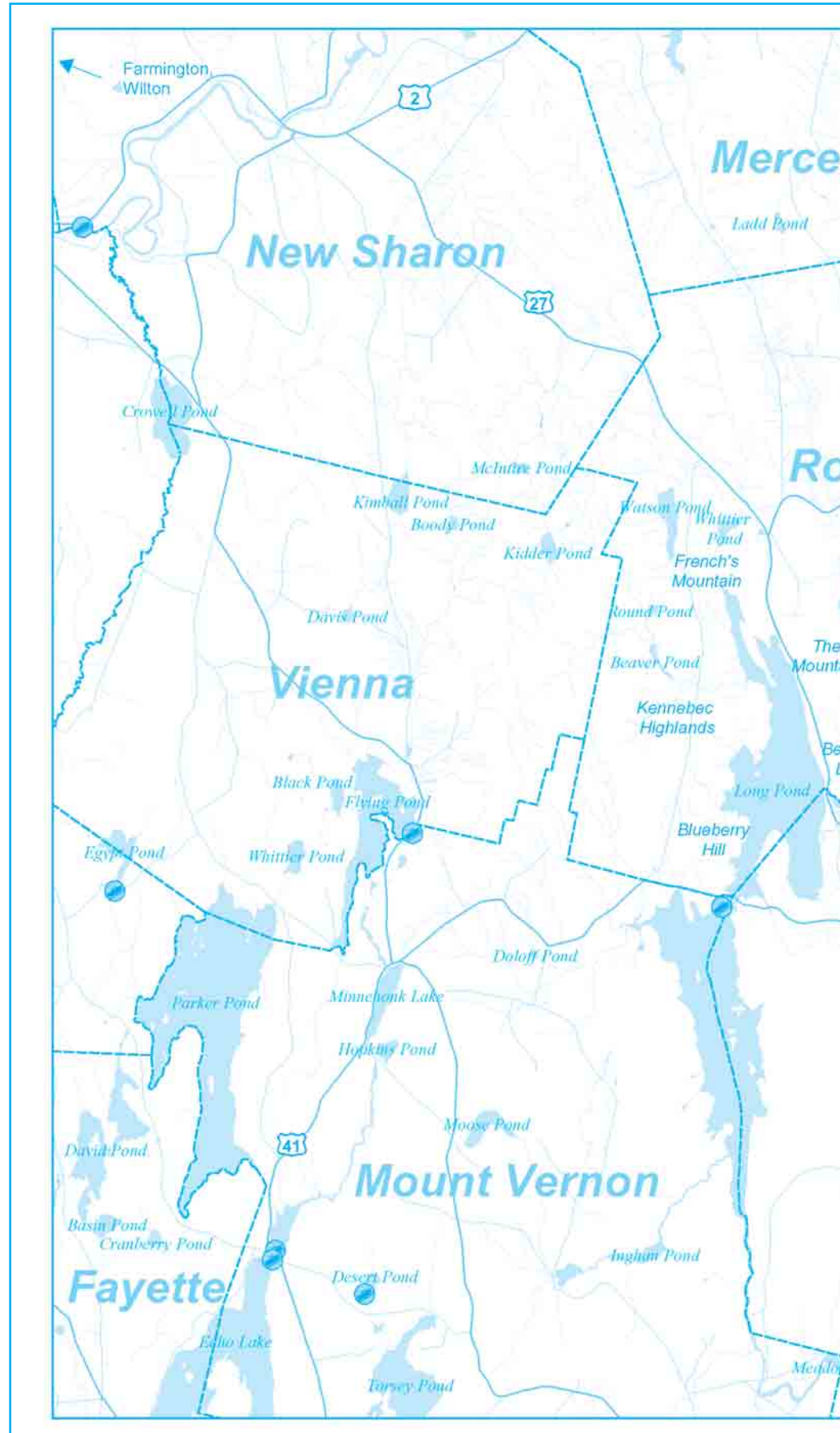

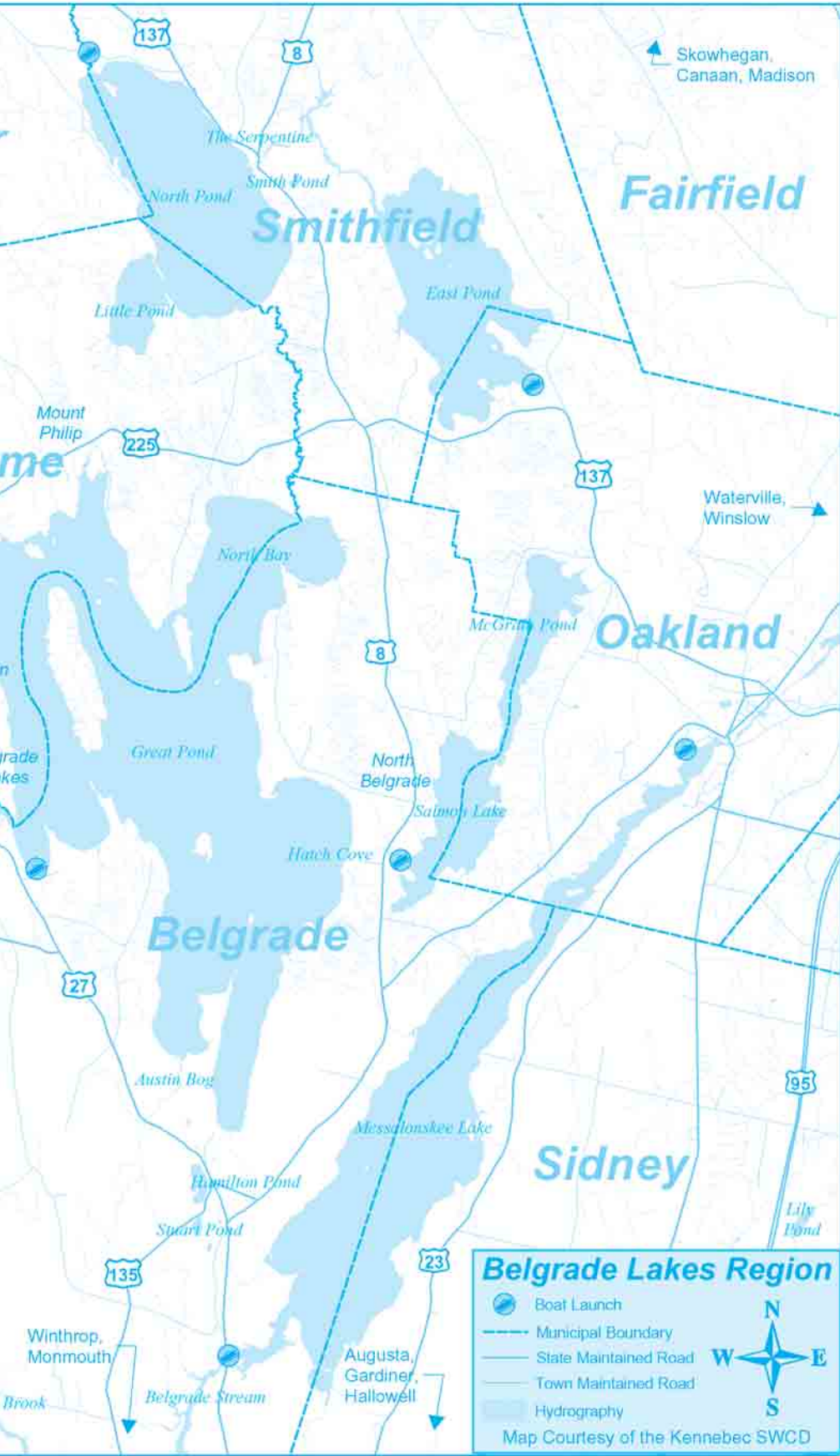

The Dams Keeper Report

Well, this is our final Dams Keeper Report for the season. Whoever said that "Summer in Maine is nothing but two weeks of bad sledding" isn't too far off the mark! It seems like summer should be getting longer with all of that global warming, but here we are regardless.

As of this writing, all of our ponds are well into their summer mode, just trying to maintain the levels we have. Great and Long Ponds are both exactly 1.44" below full with our friends over on Salmon/McGrath right now at 2.30", also below full. And our neighbors across town on Messalonskee are still right at 3.6" below full. With the exception of the hydro dam in Oakland and the 1 CFS mandate for Salmon, all of the

other dam gates are completely shut down and, with only 1.08" of precipitation forecasted for the next ten days, should remain so until the Fall-Winter Drawdown beginning in mid-October.

The 2021-22 Fall Lake Drawdown will be calling for Great and Long Ponds to be drawn down to 1.5'- 2.0' and Salmon down to 1.0'-1.5' by November 1st. Weather permitting, the drawdowns usually commences that Tuesday after the October 12th weekend. You can access the 2021-22 Winter/Fall Drawdown Schedule this fall on your Town's website or the BLA website @ https://belgradelakesassociation.org/Portals/0/21_22%20Fall%20Drawdown%20Winter%20Storage.pdf.

???Was Summer Back???

Was it just me? Or was summer BACK? Part of that feeling, for me, came from the time I spent on and around the water as part of my new post with 7 Lakes Alliance. With an insider's view, I'm even more impressed by the yeoman's work this small nonprofit performs to conserve the region's waters and the lands. To wit:

- Our Youth Conservation Corps have completed about 100 projects to stymie erosion and prevent dirt from carrying phosphorus into streams and lakes. These young people spread mountains of mulch, planted a figurative forest of lakeshore vegetation, and fortified shorelines with riches of riprap. Outstanding!

- Using clean water grants, 7 Lakes has facilitated the rebuilding of three miles of town and camp gravel roads, some of them within 200 feet of the lake, along with some bridge and culvert improvements. That work is minimizing erosion into North Pond, Great Pond, McGrath Pond and Salmon Lake. Progress!

- The herbicide treatment in Great Meadow Stream did the trick. The milfoil has been beaten back, allowing native aquatic flora and fauna to flourish. That doesn't mean milfoil is defeated. But the treatment gives our divers a puncher's chance as they continue to pull the weeds manually. And the divers have prevented the spread of curly-leaf pondweed in the Serpentine stream between East and North ponds. Hallelujah!

- Our educational and recreational programming was plentiful, diverse and well-executed, thanks in large measure to Colby College super-interns Margo Kenyon and Tamra Benson. Their creativity and resourcefulness resulted in oodles of opportunity for enlightenment. Phenomenal!

- North Pond's watershed-based management plan is in the works. The data gathered will shed light on the sources of the lake's algal blooms, and how that might best be mitigated. Erosion-control recommendations from the plan may be eligible for more clean water grants. Onward!

- 7 Lakes is fortunate to have a generous donor matching the money collected during our annual summer appeal, dollar for dollar, up to \$25,000. We appreciate the generosity of all of our benefactors who give of their time, talents and treasures. Thankful!

- Lastly, you have an incredible squad working on behalf of the lakes. The 7 Lakes team is wicked smaht (did I pronounce that right, y'all?), uber-passionate, well-springs of goodwill, impressive in their expertise and efforts, pillars of credibility, and indefatigable. In a word, they are: Marvelous!

The work of conservation does not end with the summer; it stretches into the fall, then winter, then spring. After which, we anticipate seeing you again next summer. Excelsior!





Landslide: A Novel by Susan Conley

"The afternoon had the yellow, glassy light that we get in late August in Maine, and the heat felt loose around my body so it was still possible to pretend summer wouldn't be overshadowed by fall."

If teens are in your family, you may find the constant tension with parents a release somehow in reading this novel by a Maine native who works in Portland at the Stonecoast Writing Program where she founded the Telling Room for youth.

I kept reading because island life interests me and the hospital care in Canada after a fishing boat explosion kept me wondering whether the patient would survive and return to his family back on the island in Maine.

"Everyone knows everyone in the village. This isn't meant to sound sentimental. Everyone knows where you're going in your boat, and how your daughter did in the middle-school play, and if your marriage is off the rails."

Maybe that sounds too familiar? How about, "We're running out of good places in America...Montana. Ruined. Too many people. Idaho ruined too. California and Seattle. Done. But I still get energy in Maine..."

Now that grabbed me, because energy sounds good to me, dear reader.

The wife and her two sons crossed the border from Maine to Canada to visit

their dad/husband. Separation for months is painful for all. Conversation strained. Reality of infection still present weeks later.



"In the sweet, early years on the island, the town hadn't laid underwater cable yet, and we had no electricity. We used kerosene lamps and made clearings for the gardens and built the woodpile up and fixed the house...We weren't worried about rising ocean levels or warming water. There were fish, and there was none of the anxiety I have now or shame that I'm not doing enough to help stop the warming..."

I had to laugh when I read that the mother attempted text language out loud with another adult trying to be up to date, I guess: LOL and AKT. Who talks this way?

Colby College loaned me this new 2021 title through our Belgrade Public Library inter-library loan. Belgrade Library Director Jared made this happen for me. Support our local library and keep returning books in the outside book deposit for processing. Our monthly book group enjoys meeting in the cool air conditioning and Barbara's Zoom screen keeps others participating, too. Join the eager readers! See you at the library.

How was the summer of 2022 in the Belgrade Lakes Region? I think we can sum up the summer in

Waterfront volume is down roughly the same as homes sold, the average residential home in the region sold for just under \$400,000, while the average waterfront home sold for over \$600,000. The numbers don't lie, it remains a strong real estate market locally. As we have discussed throughout the sum-

mer, there are many factors that drive the real estate market including inventory, mortgage rates and inflation. July and into August have shown signs of the market normalizing. If consumer confidence remains strong, the Belgrade Lakes Region will remain a destination for primary home and vacation home buyers.
