
On July 4, 1777 when the first anniversary of independence was celebrated, a strong, enduring (and endearing) tradition was established: fireworks!

# Maine International Film Festival is Coming!

In just a week, the Maine International Film Festival will return to downtown Waterville. The festival will present a wide selection of feature films and shorts, both documentaries and narrative, from independent producers in Maine, elsewhere in the United States, and the rest of the world

While most of the festival's 100+ offerings will be premieres of some sort (Maine, New England, United States, World), MIFF will also present retrospectives of the works of esteemed filmmakers who come to MIFF as its special guests.

The festival will open Friday evening, July 11, and will run for nine more days. All screenings will take place at the Paul J. Schupf Art Center and the adjoining Waterville Opera House.

With over 100 films to choose from, it's hard to know what to watch, but here at *Summertime in the Belgrades*, we have studied the program guide and produced this curated list of highlights:

- *The Librarians*, the documentary that opens the festival, which lauds local librarians, those steadfast defenders of freedom of expression who now face increasing challenges from groups who seek to ban books on LBGTQ+ and racial themes;
- A Mid-Life Achievement Award for British actor Clive Owen and screenings of six of his films: *I'll Sleep When I'm Dead* (2003), *Children of Men* (2006), *Closer* (2004), *Croupier* (1998), *Gosford Park* (2001), and *Duplicity* (2009);
- A Lifetime Achievement Award for Ken Eisen, cofounder of both Railroad Square Cinema and the Maine International Film Festival, festival program-

In just a week, the Maine International Film Festival mer, and president of Shadow Distribution, a will return to downtown Waterville. The festival Waterville-based distributor of independent films;

• *The Negotiator*, MIFF's Centerpiece Film, a new documentary from the United Kingdom about Waterville native George Mitchell, whose many accomplishments include negotiating an end to the "Troubles" in Northern Ireland in 1998;

- Four Made-in-Maine Feature Films, three of which are documentaries (about a sailor who survived 76 days in adrift in a life raft on the high seas, about Houlton, Me., the easternmost U.S. town in the path of the April 2024 total solar eclipse, and about the homelessness crisis in Bangor), and the fourth, *Sight Unseen*, a fictional thriller filmed in a camp on Great Pond in Belgrade;
- Three Compilations of Short Films: the Maine Narrative Shorts (fiction), the Maine Documentary Shorts (nonfiction), and the "Kaleidoscope Shorts," with eight films, some fiction and some not, from elsewhere in the U.S. and beyond;

- The Maine Student Film and Video Festival, a competition featuring the best short films from Maine filmmakers in grades K-12;
- *Dead River Rough Cut*, a newly restored 1976 documentary about two men living life on their own terms in Maine's North Woods, which will be shown with a new, shorter, fictional film, "The Constituent," written and directed by Ernest Thompson (On Golden Pond) and starring Thompson and NYPD Blue's Gordon Clapp;
- A retrospective on the work of mononymous Mainer Huey, including his *Wilderness and Spirit: A Mountain Called Katahdin* (2002), a meditative homage to Maine's highest mountain, the people who revere it, and a separate program of five of his shorts on various subjects, all made between 1977 and 1983;
- Eight other newly restored classics, ranging from *Phantom Lady*, a black and white, 1944 film noir, to Jacques Rivette's *L'Amour Fou* ("Crazy Love"), a 4+ hour opus from 1969 about a stormy romance between a theater director and his leading lady, to David Lynch's 2001 thriller *Mulholland Drive*; and finally
- "World Cinema Spotlights," which will present new and recent films from Nigeria, Cambodia, and Israel
  the Israeli films all being works of Avigail Sperber.

We'll write more about many of these screenings in the next two issues of *Summertime*, but for now, we encourag exploring the MIFF website, *www.miff.org*, or by picking up a free copy of the festival's glossy, 68-page, program booklet at the Schupf Center or at many other businesses around town. See you at the movies!



# North American Premiere of Documentary about Maine Senator George J. Mitchell, *The Negotiator*, to Screen at 28th Maine International Film Festival






The Maine Film Center will present a screening of The Negotiator during the ▲ 28th annual Maine International Film Festival (MIFF), which will be held July 11-20, 2025, in Waterville. The documentary surveys the life and work of Senator George J. Mitchell, who was born in Waterville and served as the United States special envoy to Northern Ireland during the 1990s. In 1995, President Bill Clinton appointed Senator Mitchell as his economic envoy to Northern Ireland. Mitchell later chaired the multi-party peace talks that led to the Good Friday Agreement in 1998. The film follows his involvement in the peace process, including travel between Northern Ireland, Washington, D.C., and Maine, and focuses on the efforts required to reach a political settlement. Directed by journalist Trevor Birney, The Negotiator uses interviews, archival material, and contemporary footage including on location in Waterville—to explore Mitchell's role in the negotiations and the broader context of U.S. foreign engagement. Birney previously produced KNEECAP, which closed last year's MIFF. The screening of The Negotiator is sponsored by the Unity Foundation, and will be introduced by the film's producer Stephen Douds. The film will be shown at the Waterville Opera House on July 16 at 7PM. Festival passes and tickets are available now at MIFF.org.

### A Year At 7 Lakes Alliance

Te've been looking forward to this day for at least a month, ever since spring returned to the Belgrade Lakes watershed. As is often the case, busy schedules and family commitments kept us off the water longer than we had hoped. But at last, the moment arrived: time to return to Lower Long Pond in our kavaks.

My wife Wyatt and I were fortunate to paddle on a cool, clear day. For me,

kayaking is not just recreation – it facilitates a spiritual connection with the water. I don't feel like I'm on the water, but rather a part of it. As an ecologist by training and a lifelong outdoor enthusiast, I carry this deep connection in all parts of my life and with all the work we do at 7 Lakes Alliance.

It's hard to believe a full year has passed since we returned to Maine. And in that time, so much has been accomplished - thanks to our dedicated team and the support of this remarkable community. You'll find the full story in our 2024 Annual Report (on our website:www.7lakesalliance/annual report), but a few highlights stand out:

Invasive Aquatics: Our invasive aquatics team continues to be vigilant in the ongoing control efforts which have become more complex with longer seasons and new aggressive species. Our Courtesy Boat Inspectors prevented numerous invasive plant fragments from leaving and entering our lakes.

Erosion Control: Our Erosion Control and Youth Conservation Corps completed hundreds of projects to limit sediment and nutrient runoff in our lakes.

> Education and Outreach: We launched our floating classroom boat, hosting more than 250 students who learned about lake ecology right on the water. Recreation: We expanded our trail system, including the opening of our first universal access trail.

> These milestones reflect real progress, yet we know the challenges ahead are real. Our lands and waters are more vulnerable than ever- to human impact, to unsustainable development pressure and to the accelerating effects of climate change. These shifts are arriving faster than anyone predicted just five or ten years ago, even as funding from state and federal sources becomes more difficult to secure.

Yet I remain optimistic. 7 lakes alliance has the expertise, the passion and the momentum to meet these challenges head-on and to lead in watershed science both regionally and nationally. I'm honored to be part of this organization and grateful for the strong support we receive from this community and

As Wyatt and I made our way over to Lost Pond, we paused to drift. We watched herons and loons, listened to the gentle sounds of nature, and sat in stillness. It reminded us, as it always does, of why this work matters.

Land Conservation: Over 1,000 acres were protected last year through conservation easements and fee purchases, including critical parcels near Lower Long Pond and East Pond that safeguard water quality, wildlife habitat and old growth forest.

Lake Science: Over 2,000 water quality samples have been taken in the watershed across all seasons enhancing our understanding of lake ecosystem functioning and dynamics.

#### **Belgrade History Beyond Belgrade**

n a beautiful day this past February Tom and I traveled to Thompson Ice House Museum in South Bristol to witness an old-fashioned ice harvest. Ever since I discovered some advertisements for an ice business in the attic of our old farmhouse, I have wanted to see a traditional ice harvest. Although most of the icehouses have long disappeared; the Thompson Ice House Museum is a working museum dedicated to the methods of traditional ice harvesting.



Ice was such an important commodity before the invention and everyday use of refrigeration. The ice on a pond or a river was cleared of snow and huge cakes of ice were cut with special tools and then stored in an ice-The icehouse was insulated with thick walls filled with sawdust. The ice cakes were stacked in the icehouse and covered with more sawdust.

Some folks may remember Dalton Ice Company here in Belgrade. It was located on the shore of Great Pond where the Center for All Seasons is today. The Dalton Lumber Company was located at the same place. Having a ready supply of sawdust, helped make Dalton Ice Company successful. There was a huge demand for ice delivery in the summer months. The Belgrade Hotel alone required 1,600 pounds of ice delivered daily. In addition, many of the housekeeping and youth camps needed ice delivered regularly. Dalton Ice Company closed not long after the Belgrade Hotel burned in 1956.

The Belgrade Historical Society has a nice display of ice harvesting tools at the Old Town Meeting House. Check out our display at our Open Houses, Thursday, July 10, 9-12 or Thursday, July 24, 1-4. # Foraging and Educating

The end of June usually includes the emergence of some of my favorite wild foods: yellow chanterelle mushrooms, wild strawberries, red raspberries, and cattail spikes. This past week I have been harvesting all of them. Cattails are among the favorite foods of muskrats and have also been a staple of Native Americans for millennia. Cattail shoots and roots can be harvested when they first emerge, cattail spikes when they begin to flower, and the yellow pollen that develops during the fertilization process a bit later can be collected and mixed with flour for baking things like pancakes, producing an amazing golden colored treat. I especially like the cattail spikes, the immature male flowers of cattails (Typha sp.). If you look closely at the cattail flowers emerging this time of year you will notice the male flowers emerging above the female flowers, initially contained within a thin sheath that is easy to remove. They are best tasting when they feel slightly spongy when you squeeze them. The pictures below show the harvested flowers (left-most still in the sheath) and the male spikes removed on the right. These taste like little corn cobs when boiled for a few minutes and served with butter and salt. They can also be frozen after blanching and eaten year-round.

The 7 Lakes Education and Outreach Team spent four days at Camp Tracy and used our floating classroom to get over 100 campers, counselors, and staff from Camp Tracy out on

wife, Lindsay. John has a camp on Jamaica Point and has been hiking our trails for over a half century, roughly twenty years before we owned any of them. He was "taking her outside" to introduce her to the special place they now share.

Mike Guarino, who is the Community Engagement Specialist for the Mid-Maine Chamber of Commerce, still does a bit of guiding in the Belgrades. Now that he has a "real job," Mike guides mostly on weekends, which this year means most of his trips have been on rainy days. He sent me a picture of 8-yr old Ash, who came up from MA with his dad. Mike says, "An 8 year old fish slayer! Ash fought through rain and wind and some chilly temps, and proceeded to put on a master class in smallmouth fishing."

Those of you who have been near the Kennebec Highlands lately know that the State has recently begun a planned logging har-

vest that has two "log yard" entrances off Watson Pond Rd. There is more information about this harvest at the trailhead kiosks and at the 7-Lakes office. One of the things the Maine Forest Service is doing is identifying areas where there are significant numbers of white, green and brown ash trees. They are inoculating the trees in these areas to protect many of the trees against Emerald Ash Borers (EAB) in order to create small islands of EAB-resistant trees that could help the forest survive an invasion of EAB. EAB is already in York and Aroostook County and converging towards central Maine. One of these "islands" is right near the Sanders Hill Trailhead where the "Loop" trail comes off the north side of the parking lot. The treated trees are marked with a green metal medallion at eye level.

entered into the National Inventors Hall of Fame.

So you may be wondering what happened to Milton Bradley's birthplace in Vienna? If so, you will be pleased to know it is still standing and was purchased in 2009 by the Vienna Historical Society (VHS). Their

but mighty group of board members and volunteers has since worked diligently to preserve the house as well as the history of Vienna and Mount Vernon. The c 1832 Cape Cod still retains much of its interior antiquated features, including the granite and rubble stone foundation. The cellar recently created a big problem for VHS when one of their members discovered a foot of water had leaked inside. Further inspection revealed its walls had shifted enough to endanger the stability of the entire structure. "We were told by a contractor that we were lucky the first floor didn't cave in on us," said Ingrid Grenon VHS president. The estimate to do all the interior and exterior work is about \$200,000. VHS

"This house is an important part of Vienna's history and we are going to do our best to save it," she said.





Right: Of course, this minnow was way too large for this little beak! Both parents are obviously still learning the ropes!



# Playing Games With a Familiar Name

How many times did you play "Candy Land" with your siblings or friends when you were young? As you got older you may have played "The Game of Life" as you sat around the table after a family meal? If so, did you ever notice the "MB" logo on the box? MB stands for the multi-million dollar "Milton Bradley Company," which became a name familiar to just about everyone after 1860.

Milton Bradley hailed from Vienna in Kennebec County where he was born November 18, 1836 in his parents' home. He was the only child of Lewis and Fannie (Lyford) Bradley whose parents had migrated from Rockingham County, NH to Vienna (Bradley) and Mount Vernon (Lyford) between 1799 and 1804. Since Milton was their only child the couple was especially affectionate and saw to it that he was raised in a hard-working, Christian household. They disapproved of dancing, drinking alcohol or gambling but they did enjoy playing chess and checkers with their son and they read to him in the evening. Education was important to Lewis who taught Milton mathematic concepts by using objects such as apples and the boy was a quick learner. His father's emphasis on education and their pleasure in reading and game playing came to serve Milton well as an

Lewis Bradley was a carpenter and he also ran a potato starch factory until the potato blight hit in the early 1840s and he was forced to close his business and moved his family from Maine to Lowell, MA in

1847, and from there to Haverhill. Despite changing schools more than once Milton was strong in science and math, thanks to his father's tutoring and he also became a talented artist and draftsman. He studied technical drawing at the Lawrence Scientific School at Cambridge, Massachusetts, helping to pay his tuition by giving drawing lessons and selling stationery and writing supplies to his fellow students. Due to his parents' financial restrictions, he had to leave Lawrence after a year and he went to work as a draftsman. That led to his interest in lithography.

Milton Bradley was living in Springfield, MA and

working for a railroad company as a lithologist when he got the idea for his first board game: The "Checkered Game of Life." He was 24 years old in 1860 when he decided to put all his energy into making board games and established his own company. This was reorganized in 1884 and named the Milton Bradley Company. His first venture was to New York City where he readily sold the hundreds of "Life" games he had produced himself to newsstand, stationary and department store merchants. After that his game quickly became a sensation and by 1861 he had manufactured 40,000 Games of Checkered Life.

In 1869 Bradley heard a lecture about a new concept of education for five year olds, called kindergarten. His interest was sparked and he began to champion the kindergarten philosophy of learning through play. Up until then young children had been taught through memorization of facts and numbers. Bradley began producing materials that could be used in kindergarten classrooms, such as crayons, watercolor paints and colored paper. By the end of the 19th century his company was producing about everything a school could need including: desks, chairs, tables, chalkboards, paper, paints, educational toys and games.

Milton Bradley continued to invent and make toys, games and school supplies until he died on May 30, 1911 in Springfield, MA. He is often credited as the father of board games. In 2006 he was Continued on page 11....



### The Dams Keeper Report

As of this writing, all of our pond water levels are actually pretty much where they belong – I can't believe I am writing this at this time of the summer! Thanks to what has felt like persistent showers, they really haven't amounted to much. We have only received .10" of precipitation for the past ten days with just .36" forecasted for the next ten. Normal July precipitation for our area is 3.43", so if 86"/wk. is normal, it looks like we might be headed for another drought of sorts. Great lake weather but our gardens are going to require a little bit more TLC!

Great Pond's Village dam is currently 1.44" above full pond with the main gate closed, as are all of our gates. Long Pond's Wings Mill dam is right at 2.64", also above full pond. Salmon/McGrath is exactly at .06" above full pond, essentially full pond, with its single gate valve still opened the mandated 1 cfs. flow. Our neighbors on Messalonskee are down 3.48" below full which is just a fact of life with its electricity generation needs and our current (as I write this) need for A/C! Obviously, we are back to our "Save the Water" mode.

With this past week's heat, all of our ponds lost about 3/10" per day and in doing some research, these are actually normal evaporation rates. An interesting article by C.E. Grunsky entitled "Evaporation from lakes and reservoirs", going back to September 1931, suggests that the evaporation rate with an ambient outside temperature of 85F is approximately 3/10" per day. And if that wasn't enough, about 80% of our camps still use lake water and in addition to the slight seepage from our dams, you can see why we are trying to keep the lakes at 3" above full for a little wiggle room!
