
Here's to the sun that sets ever lower and further memories of two amazing seasons merging. north but continues to provide beams that warm and sunsets that dazzle.







## Do We Need to Worry About Gloeotrichia?

If you have been out on Great Pond, Long Pond or Messalonskee Lake recently, you may have noticed small green particles drifting in the water or collecting along the shore. This is a type of cyanobacteria called gloeotrichia echinulata that has been showing up in high numbers this

"Gloeo" emerges in latesummer and can form dense scums or mats along shorelines, particularly in coves and downwind areas. Gloeo can accumulate near your

shore one day and dissipate the next day, making gloeo a challenge to predict and monitor. Often considered a nuisance algae, gloeo can cause skin irritation and rashes for some swimmers. As gloeo dies, it breaks down and has the potential to release toxic chemicals. Although we have not detected any toxins in our testing, caution is still warranted. The lake science team at 7 Lakes Alliance recommends avoiding contact with water where dense accumulations of gloeo are present. Children and dogs should be kept out of areas with dense accumulations to avoid ingesting water, and swimmers should take a shower with fresh or filtered water and soap after swimming in water with gloeo.

#### Why is This Happening?

Gloeo has been appearing more frequently and at higher abundances in recent years in otherwise clear, low-nutrient lakes across North America and Europe, including several of the Belgrade lakes. Warming water temperatures has lead to earlier and more severe depletion of oxygen on the bottom of lakes, which triggers phosphorus to be released from lake sediments and into the water

where it becomes available for algae. Phosphorus is the most important nutrient that initiates excess algae growth in our lakes. The gloeo spores develop in the bottom waters near sediment containing phosphorus, then float to the surface where they reproduce and can be distributed horizontally by wind-driven water currents. What Can We Do About Gloeo?

The Lake Science team at 7 Lakes Alliance has been monitoring gloeo progres-

sion regularly, and our volunteer monitors have been tracking abundances around the lakes as well. The solutions for the lakes start on the land. Erosion control is one of the most effective ways to reduce the amount of phosphorus entering our lakes. Actions such as:

- Maintaining a natural shoreline buffer with native plants.
- Conserving land and keeping tree cover to reduce runoff and cool the nearby land and water.
- Supporting erosion-control projects, both large and small: 7 Lakes Alliance works on both large-scale erosion control projects with towns, road associations, and smaller projects through our YCC program.

## Take It Outside -

Cuddenly the days are getting a little shorter and I am noticing more Oswamp red maples beginning to turn red in the wetlands and birches turn yellow high on the hillsides. It is still quite warm during the day, but the nights are growing cooler and we are finally beginning to get some much-needed rain. Like the birds and squirrels, I am double checking my summer "to do" list and trying to make sure everything gets done. I am amazed at how many things are still on the list. In addition to looking for mushrooms and elderberries when I hike, I find myself keeping my eyes peeled for grouse, deer, and turkey sign. Those seasons are rapidly approaching, and last year's venison supply is running low in the freezer. I have been seeing turkeys everywhere, a promising sign for the fall season. Both the loons and the bass and pike in the lakes are chasing large schools of baitfish (mostly landlocked alewives) and trying to build up fat reserves

to get through the winter. Check out the screen shot from my fish finder (Pg. 10). The warm surface layer has plenty of oxygen to support the large bass but the deeper water is largely depleted of oxygen but has enough to support the large schools of small baitfish. You can watch the larger fish dive down to grab some lunch and then return to surface layer to digest their meal. Fishing at the base of the layer, around 20 ft, with anything that looks like a minnow, will yield results. I have had good success with a white zonker fly, fished with a sinking tip flyline. I frequently catch three or four 3-to 4-pound bass one after the other.

Additionally, the loons with chicks are teaching their offspring how to catch their own food. When the chicks are first born, the parents chew up fish and crayfish and basically regurgitate food morsels into their chicks' eager open mouths. The chicks grow rapidly, and the parents soon simply bring the chicks, still wriggling morsels, which the chicks grab hungrily. After a week or so of this routine, the parents simply drop the food in the water near the chicks and the chicks need to catch their food before it escapes. At the same time, the chicks are learning to dive underwater,


which is a major step in evading airborne predators such as eagles. Soon the chicks are foraging for their own food alongside the parents. Over the next two months or so, the loons will molt, replacing their insulating down with feathers, and begin to learn to fly. Those chicks that learn to fly before the lake freezes

over will head to the ocean for the winter and eventually return to the lake, usually after two years on the ocean.

Last week, I returned from a short trip to the West Coast and headed out to one of my foraging spots in the Kennebec Highlands where I normally find quite a few blackberries and black trumpet mushrooms this time of year. There were only a handful of drought-stunted blackberries (about a third their normal size) and the black trumpets that had sprouted after a brief shower a week or so ago were only about 3/4" inch long and completely dehydrated.



## Call of the Loon



### A Loon Chick's Journey!

Loon chicks can swim and dive within their first week, but rely on their parents for warmth and food and sometimes, just transportation.



This Long Pond Tracy Cove chick is just 1-2 days old!

Loon chicks can swim and dive within their first week, but rely on their parents for warmth and food and sometimes, just transportation.



Our chick is now 2 weeks old and still covered in its nice warm down. After all, it is still mid-June.

They often ride on their parents' backs for warmth and protection during the first few weeks. Initially, parents provide all of the food, but chicks gradually start catching their own. You may even observe a parent purposely dropping a minnow directly in front of the chick to teach it how to catch its own food. By about five weeks, chicks can catch about half of their own food but still beg for food from their parents.



This Long Pond Tracy Cove chick is now 6 weeks



He/she is now 13 wks in October and ready for their inaugural trip to the central Maine coast!



A loon chick is considered fledged around 11-12 weeks old when it can fly and is supposed to be largely independent, although it will continue begging for food from its parents until the parents leave for their winter vacation, generally somewhere along the Maine coast.

Loon chicks typically leave their natal lake shortly after their parents and migrate to the coast for the winter where they will spend the next few years before returning to their natal lake or one nearby.



In 2023, they added Readfield to their service area and in 2024 they were happy to add to their volunteer driver pool as well as register several new riders. To keep that momentum going, they are always looking for new drivers, so contact them if you enjoy driving and like to help others. Additionally, if you find yourself or a loved one in need of rides to medical appointments, supermarkets, pharmacies, other errands and even social visits, please reach out and register with them before you need that ride.

This past spring, NDN received special recognition from the Maine Volunteer Foundation. The certificate read: "Exemplary Recognition: This certificate is proudly presented to Neighbors Driving Neighbors in recognition of your outstanding community service, meaningful contributions, and commitment to making a positive difference in the lives of others." The commitment of their volunteer

## Thank You and a Quick Recap

s we wind down another season of *Summertime in the Belgrades*, I'd like to Thank our readers and visitors for allowing us to share stories, real estate insights, and advice throughout the season. Selling real estate in the Belgrade Lakes Region is truly a privilege, and it's always rewarding to connect with so many people who care about this special place.

Here's a quick recap of how the 2025 summer real estate season has played out so far, looking at sales from May through mid-August:

Homes overall: From May through mid-August, 89 homes sold across the region, averaging about \$472,000. That's almost identical to last summer, when 84 homes sold at an average of \$466,000. In other words—prices have leveled off a bit, and sales volume is holding steady.

On the lakes: Lakefront living continues to shine. We saw 25 waterfront homes sell this summer, with an average price of \$845,000. Last year, the same

number of lakefront homes sold, but the average price was closer to \$743,000. So while the number of sales stayed steady, prices on the water keep climbing. What does this mean? The market here is steady and healthy. Buyers are still looking, especially for waterfront homes, and sellers are seeing solid interest. As fall approaches, the pace will naturally slow down, but serious buyers will still be out there hoping to find their spot in the Belgrades.

As fall arrives, the pace of sales will naturally slow, but life in the Belgrades never really does. The end of our Summertime season is a wonderful reminder that while one season is wrapping up, the best parts of lake life continue all year long.

## **Campers Tackle Invasive Plants**

n Thursday, July 30th, a volunteer conservation effort of significant force campers. They displayed excellent teamwork and positive energy during their showed up to Hayden Park in Belgrade, ME. The group of more than 100 volunteers, mainly consisting of campers and camp staff from Camp Somerset for Girls, worked tirelessly to cut down and bag invasive Japanese Knotweed.


Japanese Knotweed is an aggressive, bamboo-like plant which has allelopathic properties, which means this invasive plant secrets chemicals into the soil and inhibits the growth of other plants. Japanese Knotweed is known to destabilize soils and damage native ecosystems and shorelines.

As a result of Thursday's project, 72 contractor bags of weeds were removed from Hayden Park, a feat made possible due to a notably efficient effort by they



### The Dams Keeper Report

#### A WATER LEVELS PUBLIC NOTICE 8/12/25



e are in another seri-**V** ous drought which is rearing its ugly head for our farmers, gardeners and lakes residents. The above photo shows the Castle Island thoroughfare under the bridge which is still just accessible, but you'll want to trim up and watch where you are going.

The long-term forecast back in May had forecasted an average of 25% less precipitation for this summer but unfortunately here in the Belgrades, we've received significantly less. 6.85" in May, 3.32" in June, just 2.03" in July and absolutely zero in the past thirty days. Normal precipitation is around 3.42" per month.

Obviously, we haven't had the rain but to make matters worse, we lose approximately 3/10" per day due to evaporation with an air temperature of 80F. With the recent 90F+ temperatures, the loss per day is closer to 6/10''.

And if that wasn't enough, our water table is down around 8'. For comparison, it was down just 2.88' back in August 2023. When the water table drops, obviously it affects our wells but results in a phenomenon called Induced Recharge which is basically the reverse flow of our lake springs and aquifers back into the low water table. Add the additional loss from the 70% or so of our camps that still use lake water and you see why our lake water levels are where they are. Knowing we were heading into another drought, we started with our lakes 3" above full pond to give us as much breathing room as we could and despite all of our dam gates being shut down for the past two months, we are where we are. Without some significant rain, things are not going to improve.

The entire Belgrade chain of lakes are all in dire straits. Both East and North Ponds are reportedly down 12" so there is obviously nothing to flow into Great and Long Ponds.

Lastly, for those of you with boat lifts, we would suggest checking to make sure you can still get your boat off. And now is also a good time to remove that boat lift canopy while you can still access it with your boat on the lift.


